

LOCAL FILMMAKERS USE LIBRARY AS BACKDROP



HEDBERG PUBLIC LIBRARY IS A LOT OF THINGS FOR A LOT OF PEOPLE IN THE COMMUNITY. BUT A MOVIE SET?

Absolutely, says Janesville filmmaker, Brad Allen. Over a couple of days in November and December, Allen and his co-directors Mike Alan Watson and Jonathan Major Condon used HPL as the setting for their short film Immortal Author.

The three-scene film, screenplay by Allen, opens with a shot of HPL's recognizable lower entrance and leads the viewer up its striking staircase.

"The spiral staircase is such a defining feature of the library," says Allen. "We thought that would be good to showcase—it is exciting to viewers."

While the library features prominently in the film, Allen says the idea of it being the primary setting came late in the project process.

"We originally planned to film outside maybe Palmer Park," he relates. "But as it was getting closer to winter, casting took longer than expected and we were worried about it snowing on the day of shooting." Allen and his directing partners explored a few options and decided to look at filming at HPL. He reached out to HPL Assistant Director, Charles Teval, and the two arranged for the cast and crew to film at the library.

"Our mission is to provide services and resources to the community," said library director, Bryan McCormick.

"It was our pleasure to be able to partner with a local filmmaker, and to have the library as a setting and integral part of their production."



Allen is no stranger to the public library. He and his family moved to Janesville when he was just six, and he grew up taking part in HPL's Summer Library Challenge, reserving computer time for video games, and borrowing movies he couldn't find at the local video store. "I spent a bunch of time there," he recalls.

Additionally, the UW-Whitewater graduate self-published a book he wrote through his teenage years, Fallen Heroes: Exoneration, which is still available for checkout at HPL.

"I've taken it off the market because I want to do some revisions," Allen notes. "I'm close to having that done and will re-release it."

He also recently connected with Kara Blue, HPL Public Services Librarian, at a Forward Janesville networking event



Allen says incentives provided by the Summer Library Challenge and the influence of his family and school programs motivated him to read, which benefited his writing skills.

"Having the resource of the library and encouragement as a kid to read, that has paid off later in life," he says.

HPL hosted a screening of Immortal Author on Thursday, February 2. After viewing the short film, cast and crew joined Allen to answer questions, and discuss how the project was brought to life, what ideas they hope viewers take away from the story, and other details about the process of creating and sharing film projects with local and online audiences.

In addition to promoting the short film, Allen hopes the screening will encourage others interested in film production to pursue the craft.

"Anyone can do it," he says. "You can jump in-don't feel unqualified. We're not professionals; we hope to encourage others that way. If it helps other people to learn about the process and help them get a leg up, that's awesome."

Preparing to open a small business and then keep it running requires a lot of research! Library staff dedicate half-day training to creating dynamic a culture of inclusive excellence.
