# **NEW! SENSORY-FRIENDLY STORYTIME**



Mariah Smitala, HPL's Youth Services Librarian, began the process of adding a sensory friendly storytime to the Hedberg Public Library calendar in 2019. She attended webinars, visited other libraries to attend their sensory storytimes, and did a lot of research. Finally, in spring of 2020, the Children's Room was ready to launch, the new program. Alas, the world had other plans.

The library canceled all programming due to COVID-19 on the day the team was meant to host its first-ever sensory friendly storytime, and shut down all together the following day.

"It was devastating to put this program on hold," said Smitala. "But now, nearly 5 years later, it is finally time to introduce it to our families!"

On the first Friday of the new year, HPL will host its first SENSE-ational Storytime. This sensory-friendly program has been thoughtfully designed with our neurodivergent patrons and those who have sensory processing needs in mind, but all are welcome. The storytime begins at 9:45 am with a 15-minute playtime in our program room.

After putting the toys down for a nap, attendees will make their way to their individual floor seat for 30 minutes of rhymes, songs, and of course stories. Those in need of extra stimulation can grab a fidget or two to use during the storytime, and those that benefit from lower stimulation will appreciate a program without bright screens or loud music. All attendees will benefit from a visual schedule and many songs and rhymes that remain consistent every week.

It was more complex, funnier, and tastier than I had imagined.

This challenge required a steady hand, patience, perseverance – and enough willpower not to eat all the chips before the ring was completed! (Some groups made U shapes due to the whole "don't eat the chips" part.)

We are about to start our third year of **Homeschool Idea Lab** in February. I just love IDEA LAB so much. Our weekly themes will be (in order): Contraptions, Cause & Effect, Eggcellent Ideas, and Smorgasbord.

What I love most about it is: IDEAS & LAB. We get to have a ton of ideas and see what happens and how the group experiments with the sparks we provide. Our themes change each week, but we always encourage the kids to work at their own pace and try what they want to try. We usually end up having a ton of fun and learning something new.

If you have a homeschooled student who might enjoy group and individual challenges, join us. We will meet each Tuesday in February from 2 to 3 p.m. Our themes will be announced

soon, so stay tuned for that information!

Last year, we received requests for a morning social time for our homeschooled families in addition to Idea Lab. We heard and hope you will join us at **Homeschool Games Galore** on Tuesday mornings in January from 9:30 to 11:30 a.m. Library staff will have some games on hand for families to play, but participants are welcome to bring their own, too. This is a drop-in, self-directed social time for families. Staff will not be leading activities (or challenges). Please come and enjoy time together playing games.

It has been so much fun getting to know our homeschool families a bit better through Idea Lab and now, I hope, through Games Galore. We are open to your ideas and would love to know how we can better serve our homeschool families.




